- ✓ How open and willing to go to an Extraordinary Mass.


### Methodology

- Online quantitative survey
- <u>Questionnaire</u>: approximately 5 minutes
- ✓ <u>Target</u>: online population, men and women, 16+ years old, classes ABCD, Catholics
- ✓ Sample: 1.032 interviews with Catholics
- ✓ This survey has been conducted online by IBOPE CONECTA for Paix Liturgique from 02 to 14 of June 2017. It has been addressed to a sample of 3.259 Brazilians among which 1.032 considered themselves as Catholics.



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35% of the online population in Brazil consider themselves Catholics. We interviewed 1.032 Catholics, distributed as below (based on online population):









4. Would you find it normal if your parish church celebrated the Mass in both forms, both the modern way, known as "ordinary", in Portuguese, and traditional, know as "extraordinary", in Latin and with Gregorian Chant?



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Only 9% wouldn't go if the Mass were prayed in the Extraordinary form. On the other hand, 27% said that they would attend the Extraordinary Mass every week, and 29% only occasionally.

#### Highlights

- ✓ 35% of the online population in Brazil consider themselves Catholics and we interviewed 1.032 Catholics.
- ✓ 33% of the Catholics attend the Mass every week,, 20% attend monthly, 9% attend only solemn festivals e 38% only occasionally, such as weddings, baptism, etc.
- ✓ 59% of the Catholics interviews the didn't know the Mass could be performed in two different ways. Classes A and B stand out for knowing there are two way to celebrate a Mass.
